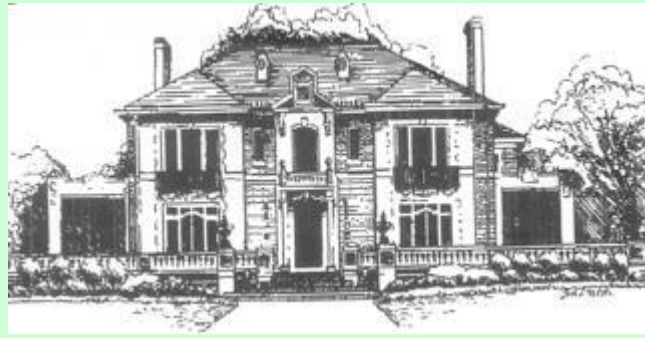

16th Annual Preservation Achievement Awards

Scottish Rite Cathedral

This year the honoree is the Swiss Avenue Historic District for the incredible work that has been done since the 1970's to save this important neighborhood. In the early 70s the district was threatened with redevelopment and zoning changes which would have destroyed its historic character. Getting the neighborhood placed on the National Register of Historic Places and getting it designated as a City of Dallas Landmark district helped to stabilize the neighborhood and protect investment in the grand homes from the early 1900s.

This was a huge undertaking and took many people to make it happen.
